Attendance

As mentioned last newsletter, our school attendance target is 93.7% and we would like to commend the 685 students who have either met or exceeded this target for Term 1. We all know how important regular attendance is and it is great to see that our school community is also committed to this.

We do need to mention however that if your child is sick with cold like symptoms or generally feeling unwell that they should stay home and recuperate. In such instances we ask that parents provide an explanation within 7 days of the first absence. As part of our school procedures the school will call on the 2nd day of an absence to follow up on absences, if an explanation has not already been provided.

Building a national picture of child health

From May 2024, our school, along with thousands of others across the country, will participate in the Australian Early Development Census (AEDC).

The AEDC is a teacher-completed census (similar to a questionnaire) which provides a comprehensive picture of how children have developed by the time they start their first year of full-time school.

The AEDC is an Australian Government Initiative and is completed nationally every three

Children don't miss any class time while the AEDC is completed, and parents/carers don't need to supply schools with any new information.

The data collected through the AEDC is used by schools, communities and governments to better understand children and families' needs, and identify the services, resources and support they

AEDC data is reported at a school, community state/territory and national level. AEDC results for individual children are not reported and the AEDC is not used as an individual diagnostic tool.

tool.

Some teachers have found that completing the AEDC made them more aware of the needs of individual children and their class, and that the data was useful for planning for transitions to Year 1 and developing programs.

Participation in the AEDC is voluntary, however the AEDC relies on all schools with children in their first year of full-time school participating in the collection. Parents/carers don't need to take any action unless they choose not to include their children in the census.

- Online orders Do <u>not</u> require an envelope returned to your school.
- Sibling Photos Don't forget to pre-order your sibling photos online up to 24 hours before photo day. We provide your school with a list of sibling orders right up to the day of photography, so no one misses out. Sibling photographs only apply to children enrolled at your school.
- Late fees A late fee will be applied to each package purchased after photo day due to the additional cost of producing these packages separately.
- Package delivery School photographs will be returned approximately 6 weeks after the day of photography.
 Please note this delivery timeframe is dependent on proofing and additional photography days at your school.

• Previous Years' photos - Past years' photographs including sports, co-curricular and representative groups are also available to order under the "previous years or group photo" tabs at your school's advancedorder site when you click on the "Order School Photos Here" button above. You can also order past packages, portrait images and gifts from your child's unique, individual and secure advancedyou image archive site using the unique 9 digit image code found on packages you have ordered in the past.
