I am aiming to have an informal coffee morning every term where families have the chance just to stop and talk. A goal of the school this year is to solicit parent feedback and act accordingly and these informal coffee mornings are just one way we are partnering with our community. Thank you also to the parents that completed our survey on Open Day. If you didn't get the chance to complete the survey, a QR which can be scanned on any device has been included below. We truly value your opinions, feedback and suggestions.



Throughout the week we also had the chance to celebrate the artistic talents of our students. This year we have 8 different performance groups and on Tuesday and Thursday they amazed everyone with their abilities. Congratulations to the students that performed and thank you to the parents that attended. Also this week we celebrated Visual Arts with our school Art Auction. At one point there was a bidding frenzy and I thank all families for supporting the event. The school raised just over \$3000 which will be used towards new outdoor seating around the school.



Website

It is with great pleasure that I can reveal that the school website has received an entire overhaul and will be launched on the 17th August. The website will now contain an up to date calendar, news section, newsletters and a collection of galleries. We will continue to build upon the new website throughout the year but it will become a major source of information for the school. Last fortnight the school ran a parent workshop that was very well attended on resilience. I thank all the parents that attended and the feedback I have received has been extremely positive. Our local Police Liaison Officer will be presenting the session with all families invited. We look forward to your attendance and answering any questions you may have.



School Plan

Last week we received a visit from the Director Educational Leadership to discuss the progress we have made on our three year school plan. We have already made significant progress towards our initiatives which are highlighted below:

Strategic Direction 1 – The school is completing a thorough analysis of literacy and numeracy goals and is already forward thinking for 2019 programs. School scope and sequence documents are also being adjusted to reflect current school practices and new curriculum documents and ensure our students are obtaining the best possible education.

Strategic Direction 2 – The school is engaging in staff identified, differentiated professional learning to build capacity to deliver quality evidence based educational programs. Formal and informal lesson observations and mentoring in staff identified areas. Developed a network to support beginning teachers in improving their professional practice applied to deep knowledge, higher-order thinking, meta-language and communication. Developing capacity to analyse and communicate data, focused on monitoring and processing whole school growth and performance

Strategic Direction 3 – The school continues to investigate ways to better Communicate, Educate and Celebrate with the community. We are soliciting parent feedback, communicating

school targets, running parent workshops and celebrating artistic, behaviour and academic success. We will continue to roll out new initiatives throughout the year.

Uniform

Students are expected to wear the Jasper Road Public School uniform every day with pride. The school uniform and dress code requirements were developed in consultation with the school community and reflect community standards. They are currently consistent with health and safety requirements, antidiscrimination and equal opportunity legislation and will be evaluated at years end for any changes in policy.

The wearing of school uniforms by students will assist school communities in:

- defining an identity for the school within its community
- developing students' sense of belonging to the school community
- providing an opportunity to build school spirit

I ask that all families support the school in ensuring that their child/ren are dressed in full school uniform everyday including ties and tab ties in winter.

Playground

Over the past fortnight I have noticed an increasing number of students playing on the playground equipment after school. Please be aware that this area is not supervised after school and students will be informed that it is out of bounds. I thank the community in advance for supporting this as we ensure student safety is a priority.

We must report that we have been advised of delays in the installation of the Support Playground. Despite our strong planning efforts, the delays are beyond the control of the school. We hope to share opening date news with the community very shortly. During the construction phase, our students continue to be catered for in other appropriate areas of the school.

School Run 4 Fun Colour Explosion

Last week all students received a sponsorship form for the upcoming School Run 4 Fun Colour Explosion. I thank the P&C in advance for their organisation of this event and I know the teachers and students are looking forward to a great event. 

Herogram Messages




