Principal's Address

Welcome back to Term 4. I hope all families had a relaxing holiday break and had the chance to share some time together.

Sensory All Abilities Playground

This week, the official opening of our Sensory All Abilities Playground was held. This was a fantastic opportunity to celebrate what is possible when State and Federal governments joint fund a project with the school and P&C. On Monday morning I excitedly went down to the playground to see our first students using the new equipment. There were smiles all around with students playing and using their senses to explore the area. My thanks to the multitude of people that made this project possible.

Grounds Improvements

As mentioned in previous newsletters, I have been busily working behind the scenes on improvements to school facilities and grounds. One such project was finally brought to fruition during the holidays with the laying of artificial turf behind E Block. The project was due for completion on the last day of the break but unfortunately due to the significant rain that we received this was not possible. I am continuing to work with the contractors to ensure this project is completed as soon as possible.

Over the coming term I am hopeful that a number of other projects will also be completed. Whether these are small changes like the replacement of drain covers or larger projects like the playground and artificial turf installation, the students at Jasper Rd PS deserve facilities that are safe and 'state of the art' and we are definitely heading in the right direction.

Class Structures

Three years ago the decision was made to move students into stage classes. As the new Principal, I have been evaluating this decision through data on academic and social progress. Before a decision is made for 2019 class structures. I would

like to gather parent opinion. A short survey has been created allowing for parents to voice their opinions on the positive and/ or negative effects that have seen in their children. The survey should only take 2 minutes and we will open to the community until 2 November. A decision on 2019 class structures will be communicated to the community in a future newsletter.

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Stage 2 STEM

Yesterday we had 12 students from Stage 2 attend the first Hills Hub STEM Extension Day. These students were identified through activities in class and represented the school magnificently. Throughout the day they completed a number of word and number challenges before working with students from other schools and high school mentors on STEM activities. This is just one way that we are providing extension opportunities for our students at Jasper Rd. We look forward to continuing this program in 2019.

Some helpful ideas to support your child's learning

Strategies for home and school for <u>all children</u> but especially for those on the AS

Sue says "Executive functioning refers to the part of your brain that organises, prioritises and regulates emotions. However, I prefer to refer to it as the 'Air Traffic Control.' It's just like air traffic control has to manage thousands of planes on countless runways with perfect timing, students have to manage information and distractions.

Impaired Executive Function can impact significantly on children with autism spectrum disorder's ability to learn and engage in busy learning environments.

Students may not struggle with all areas of Executive Functioning to the same degree. It is important to identify which areas the child needs supports, and put in place strategies to support and develop this skill. I find that if the child has had an assessment by a psychologist it is worth checking which areas were identified as impaired and then using these results to help guide the strategies used to improve their executive functioning.

I find that strategies to address Executive Functioning are often helpful for ALL students but are particularly VITAL for students with ASD/AHD in making a difference to their learning, behaviour and social skills.

Fortunately, we can improve executive functioning skills through a range of strategies, below are some examples.

1. <u>Emotional Control</u> This is where they have difficulty with behaviour and emotional control. This can look like difficulty waiting for a turn, getting frustrated easily, off task behaviours, overreaction to the smallest things (e.g. not being first), becoming overwhelmed or meltdowns.

How to Improve Emotional Control

- Sensory tools, break cards, take a break tables,
- Emotion Cards that communicate how they are feeling and what to do to repair emotions.
- Resources like 'The Kids Guide to Being Awesome and in Control' are full or great strategies for teaching emotional regulation see Available at www.suelarkey.com.au
- Social Scripts that help students with turn taking, waiting, putting hand up to wait for a turn.
- 2. <u>Impulse Control</u> This can be calling out, distracting others, aggression /fighting, rushing through activities without checking or inconsistency with following rules.

How to Improve Impulse Control

- Redirection telling them 'what to do' not 'not what to do' i.e. 'Put your hand up' rather than 'No Calling out'
- Social Scripts that explain how to put up hand, rules for playground and group work
- Pre-warn about rules and expectations in specific situations: use visuals where possible
- 3. Planning and Prioritising This is where they have difficulty deciding the steps needed to reach a goal order of importance. As a result they may get no work done, be easily distracted, avoid tasks and may be easily overwhelmed. They may also have trouble seeing the main idea and easily go off topic

How to Improve Planning & Prioritising

- Visual Planning Supports such as: Mindmaps, Rubrics,
- Support Staff spending individual time with the student to help break down tasks down, prioritise and plan
- Using Calendars, diaries (make sure have set times to write in and check)
- Break Tasks into set up small achievable steps, tick off each step when completed
- 4. **Organising** This includes ability to keep track of information and things.

How to improve organisation

- Systems in place for organisation i.e. own hook in bag area away from busy areas
- Minimising equipment and books i.e. one book/folder or limiting the size of pencil case and its contents
- Take Photos of how desk/locker/bag should look so remind them where things go
- Help write down plans and thoughts and organise logically.
- 5. <u>Task Initiation</u> This often looks like a student sitting doing nothing, being oppositional 'I am not doing it' or procrastinating (need toilet etc.). When in actual fact they are often just so overwhelmed they don't know how to start.

How to Improve Task Initiation

- Give a Partner to work with, who can model what to
 do
- Limit and write down instructions where possible
- Simplify worksheets
- Traffic Light Strategy
- 6. **Flexibility** They often don't like to change or stop in the middle of an activity. They don't see other options or solutions and often don't understand what is being asked of them. This can result in arguing, getting frustrated /angry and meltdowns. Often they take things literally.

How to improve flexibility

- Timers to pre-warn when to finish.
- Routines/Schedules? Understand their need to know what is happening when.
- Pre-warn about changes (people and events) Explain changing and AT replacement i.e. Mum is picking you up today as grandma is at the doctor
- Use Social Scripts that give clear descriptions of what is going to change/new and what I need to do.
- 7. **Working Memory** This is the inability to hold information in their mind and use it to complete a task. Struggle with multi-step tasks, remembering directions, taking notes or understanding something you've just explained to them.

How to Improve Working Memory

Visuals -The more visuals the better

- Model SHOW what you want, don't Tell
- Co-actively do activities: learn best BY DOING and being involved in learning ie hand over hand for handwriting.
- Slow it down, Break it Down (instructions etc)
- Get them to repeat in own words instructions/ direction"




Crunch&Sip

Crunch&Sip is a good opportunity for children to stay hydrated as they lose fluid when being active, especially over the summer months. Over the warmer months, a cold drink bottle filled with water is ideal for hydration but also keeps lunchbox food items cool.

So what do these graphs mean? Since our UV levels are amongst the highest in the world, it is unlikely that children who spend some time outside each day will be vitamin D deficient. Wearing sensible sun protection has been shown to have little effect on vitamin D levels whereas the risk of skin cancer in Australia is proven. Tens of thousands of Australians exhibit the obvious symptoms of sun induced skin damage.



Swim Scheme

With more than 270 people drowning in Australia each year, it's an important opportunity for students to build on their swimming skills. We encourage parents to ensure their child attends each session throughout the 2 week program. Please ensure that your child brings his/her swimmers, towel etc to school every day over the course of the fortnight-long program. 2019 Kindergarten Enrolments



We are taking enrolments for Kindergarten 2019, if you have a child or know of anyone living in the JRPS catchment area whose child turns 5 by July 31 2019 please come to the office to collect an Application to Enrol Form or download from our website:

The following documents will be required when submitting your application.

- your child's birth certificate or identity documents
- proof of student's address originals of different documents such as your council rates notice or residential lease and electricity bill
- Immunisation history statement based on the Australian Childhood Immunisation Register (ACIR)
- family law or other relevant court orders (if applicable).

If your child is not a permanent resident you will also need to provide:

- passport or travel documents
- current visa and previous visas (if applicable).

We are happy to help with any questions you have about your enrolment, please call the school office between the hours of 9:30am – 2pm, Monday to Friday.

Enrolling your child in Term 3 assists the school to plan Kindergarten numbers for next year as well as informing you of our Orientation Program. If parents/carers believe their child will need additional support to successfully transition to Kindergarten please contact Mrs Vanessa Rogers, Deputy Principal, to organise an enrolment interview.

We will endeavour to undertake this water testing later in the year.

Debating at Jasper Road

Students who have been involved in the Debating Program at Jasper Road PS have enjoyed outstanding success over many years. Stage 3 students who are interested in trying out for the Debating Teams attend the Western Sydney Debating Camp at Katoomba in March each year. Trials for two debating teams take place in Term 1 and 10 students are selected from a total of 25-30 who try out each year.

Two teams of 5 students each then participate in the Year 5 and 6 division of the Premier's Debating Challenge, a

comprehensive state-wide competition involving hundreds of teams and thousands of students in both primary and high schools. Western Sydney Region alone is comprised each year of between 85-100 teams. In each debate, the students select their topic and their affirmative / negative status in relation to the topic and receive only one hour of unassisted preparation time with no adult input regarding their ideas and arguments.

The Jasper Road Articulators team has progressed through four round debates, a Quarter Final and a Semi-Final debate to win the Western Sydney Final on five separate occasions, in 2008, 2009, 2013, 2014 and 2016. Each time that the team has won the Western Sydney Regional Final they have attended the Premier's Debating State Championships at Stanwell Tops Conference Centre in November, competing against the winning schools from the state's other nine regions. Jasper Road Public School has won their regional debating final (Western Sydney Region) a greater number of times than any other individual school in NSW has won their regional final and then moved on to the Premiers Debating State Championships to represent their region.

The 2018 Jasper Road PS Articulators Debating Team will participate in a semi-final debate early in Term 4 and will hopefully move on to win a 6th Western Sydney Final!
