Principal's Address

2018 P&C Executive

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the 2018 Executive team and P&C members. Thank you to all those parents and members who get involved whether it be running or volunteering at events, cooking BBQs, helping out at working bees, counting cash donations or running the café during Orientation, your ongoing support contributes to the fantastic culture at Jasper Rd. To those that have held an Executive position or been involved in one of the Sub-committees, I must give special thanks for making my first year at Jasper Rd such a rewarding experience. I know some of you are moving on and I would like to personally thank you for the time you have taken in ensuring that the P&C continues to play a very active role in supporting the school.

President's Report Jasper Road Public School P&C Association Annual General Meeting – 12 November 2018

This is my final year on the P&C as my youngest son, Jackson is moving on to high school. I joined the P&C 4 years ago and served just this last year as President after two years as Vice President under the previous President, Karen Titterton - thanks to Karen for her leadership.

It has been an honour & a privilege to lead the team of tireless workers that make up our P&C. Many thanks must go to all the members of the P&C Executive Committee, the Fundraising Committee, the Band Committee and all the parent volunteers that make all our activities such a success. Thanks to Evelyn for stepping into the vacant Secretary's role and keeping us all organised, to Karen for her continuing commitment to the school – this year as Vice President, to Deryck (Deck) our second Vice President for his sound advice and to Nicole for her financial management.

Special recognition should also go to Shontelle as the leader of our Fundraising sub-committee. She has been a tireless worker and has adapted to new ideas and should feel very relaxed in moving on from her role as Fundraising Coordinator leaving behind some very well documented procedures that will make her successor's role an easier one. And thanks also to Wiebke who helped with this documentation.

This year's fundraising income was over \$52,000, boosted in large part by the very successful Colour Run. In addition, we received the grant funding of \$70,000 that we were awarded last year for the All-Abilities Sensory Playground project, and we added to this \$39,000 that had been raised in prior years resulting in a total payment from the P&C to the school of \$109,000. The school paid \$35,000 for the remainder of the project cost with a total cost of approximately \$142,000. I attended the formal opening on 19 October and it was a joy to see the smiles on the happy faces of the kids.

I was lucky to be part of the selection panel that chose our Principal, Craig Warner. I trust he will give us many years of stable long-term leadership, something we have sorely needed for some time.

Thank you to Craig and to our deputies Debby and Vanessa for your leadership this year, and to all our teachers, office staff and support staff for your dedication to our school, to our children and to our community.

I have found it very rewarding to give back to the community by being part of the P&C and I would encourage every parent to participate in some way, either by donating their time to a fundraising effort or by joining a committee.

I know that I am richer for the experience of my time on the P&C at Jasper Road. I hope I have left the school and the P&C a little better than when I started this journey.

SCHOOL IMPROVEMENTS

It is with great excitement that I 'unveiled' two large projects over the past week. After numerous conversations, artificial grass was laid behind E Block to the huge relief of our students. The selected grass is 'premium' with optimal drainage and no heat retention. Students have already begun playing on the surface and smiles have been prominent on their faces. This grounds improvement will have so many physical and health benefits for our students. I have also this week unveiled the new front entrance to the school. This upgrade was sourced through DoE funding and allows for students with a disability to access the office area whilst creating a welcoming space. I hope to unveil many more upgrades around the school in the coming weeks. As I have previously written, our students deserve a first class education with state of the art facilities.



CLASSES

Three years ago the decision was made to move students into stage classes. As the new Principal, I have been evaluating this decision using data on academic and social progress including Tell Them from Me survey results, NAPLAN data, internal school testing and LST referrals. I would like to thank the large percentage of parents that also took the survey voicing their opinions on the positive and/or negative effects that have seen in their children.

After an intensive evaluative process, I have made the decision that the majority of classes will be grade based next year. Due to school numbers there is still a likelihood that 1-2 composite classes may exist and students will be selected for these

classes on a number of factors including academic progress, social skills and independence. No parent requests will be taken for or against their child being in a composite class.

HILLS LEARNING HUB

Last week I was invited to attend the Learning in the Hills Drop In morning tea. Learning in the Hills has been assisting the community for 50 years and fortnightly for the rest of the year they will be offering a drop in service to the community with a coffee van available along with the Staples Bag pop up shop. All community members and parents are invited to attend.

REMEMBRANCE DAY

Last Friday I was overwhelmed by the heartfelt Remembrance ceremony run during the 3-6 Assembly. Prior to recess at 11am, all students in the school observed a 1 minute silence to remember the soldiers that fought for our country and honour 100 years since the guns fell silent. I would like to thank Mrs Whyte, Mrs Keast and Mr Gosper for their organisation of the service and congratulate the students for the respect they showed throughout.



NATIONALS!

Congratulations to Lucie F in Year 6 for another amazing achievement. Lucie has been successful in winning through to the National Athletics Championships to be held in Melbourne. Lucie set a personal goal at the start of the year to make the championships and she has certainly achieved. In my many years on teaching, this is the first time a student at one of my schools has made the National championships and for Lucie to achieve this feat twice in one year in Cross Country and Athletics is a massive triumph. Weather Warning

With the change in weather, and an increase in pollen being blown through the sky, it reminds me of how the weather can affect our senses, and how we need regular check-ups for these. Some children develop hay fever or runny noses, which can affect a child's hearing. Others eyes get scratchy, dry and uncomfortable.

So here is a brief note about the importance of regular eyesight and hearing check-ups. Just as adult eyesight and hearing abilities change as we get older (unfortunately), so too do those of our children. Recommendations have changed recently for how often these should be checked.

As a general rule, with the increase of screen-time for children, it is recommended that eyesight be checked at critical phases in a child's life, particularly when there is change. An eye examination every 2 years if no vision correction is required, or annually if glasses are recommended. With 80% of what is taught in schools being presented visually, it is crucial that we regularly check their eyesight. It is recommended for children to have their first eye test by age 3 (many children also get them tested whilst at preschool). Conditions such as squinting

and lazy eye can often be treated more effectively if picked up earlier.

Hearing is another sense which changes as you grow. Younger children are more prone to glue ear and fluctuating hearing loss. As children grow, the shape of their head changes, which allows the fluid from their noses to drain better. As they develop the ability to blow their noses independently, and hold their nose whilst blowing to unblock their ears, there is an increased ability to regulate their hearing. They also begin to realise when they miss out on hearing things, although children with a hearing loss will often be able to develop compensatory strategies to assist them coping in life. Some children also find that they are unable to hear certain frequencies. Others are able to hear frequencies which adults are unable to, which results in them being over-sensitive and over-stimulated by noise.

An audiologist is the person to test your child's hearing. Not all hearing centres / audiology clinics test children, so it is important to enquire as to whether they are suitable for your child. A referral from a GP may assist in a rebate for the cost of the hearing assessment. Although all newborns undergo screening at the hospital. For children, it is recommended to get their hearing tested before they start school, before Year 1, and any other time you are concerned about your child's hearing or learning/attention. When people reach 18, it is recommended hearing be checked every 3 years as it often occurs gradually.

Once children are at school, things may often also be picked up that are not apparent whilst at home or preschool. If you do have any information or reports it can be useful for teachers to have these.

If you would like any further information about hearing and eyesight do not hesitate to talk to your local GP.

Staff car parks

Please be reminded there is no parking for parents in the Jasper Road staff car park between 7:30am and 4:30pm for safety reasons. We do not have sufficient car spots for all staff members, meaning the car park is very full with cars often needing to double park. As such, we cannot accommodate parents/carers driving into this car park during these hours. Please make use of the pick-up / drop-off zone on Jasper Road.

Staffing 2019

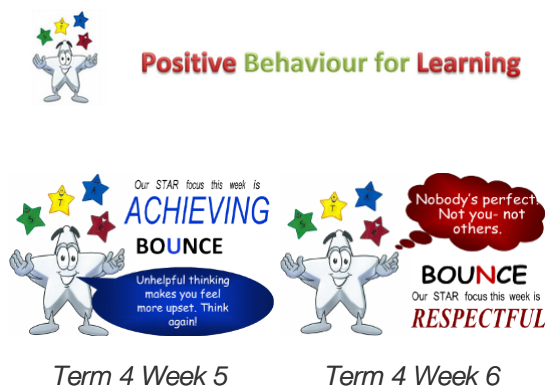
Forming classes is a complex process.

Due to an unknown number of new enrolments and student departures, a definite class structure will be provided next year. As with many schools, class numbers are changing constantly. Staffing in schools is determined by a staffing formula dependent on the number of students enrolled in each grade in the school. This is why we regularly request that you to let us know what your plans are for the following year.

We will not know the exact number of students or classes until our kindergarten students arrive for their first day in 2019.

2019 class teacher allocation for Years 1 to 6 will be revealed next year after the final numbers are confirmed. Therefore, please don't inquire about the allocation of teachers as we do not know at this stage.

All staff across the school are trained to teach all grades K-6.



Peer Support

This year all students from K-6 at Jasper Road Public School are participating in a five week, Peer Support Program. This program is a student-led multi age program which provides a fun and engaging environment for students to address social issues. It encourages peer connections throughout the school and assists students in developing practical skills to enhance social and emotional well-being, allowing students to form relationships as well as develop empathy and a sense of responsibility for students which they might not typically engage with. This process supports us to achieve and maintain a positive school culture. It empowers students to support each other and contribute positively to our school and community. It caters for student wellbeing, student leadership with teacher support and helps to develop a supportive learning environment.

All year 6 and some year 5 students undertook an intensive ½ day training course to enable them to lead their allocated group of up to 8 students through a series of sessions, which are based on our particular focus of developing resilience or the ability to “bounce back”. The structure and content combined seek to build protective factors such as sense of self, sense of possibility, connectedness and resilience, as well as establish a shared language across the school community.

Student Transport Information for 2019

School student applications for 2019 open from Monday, 15 October 2018.

Students progressing to year 3 and year 7 do not need to re-apply if they:

- are continuing at the same school
- are residing at the same address
- have not been sent an expiry notification from Transport for NSW.

Where a student meets the new distance eligibility, the system will automatically update their entitlement. If they do not meet the new eligibility, they will receive an expiry notification.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If students need to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to the link below.

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2018 to ensure student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card is not cancelled. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2018, the system will automatically cancel a card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out during December 2018 and January 2019.

Students residing in Rural and Regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the commencement of the new school year from their nominated operator. Note: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students should check with their operator for more information.

UPSKILLING TEACHERS



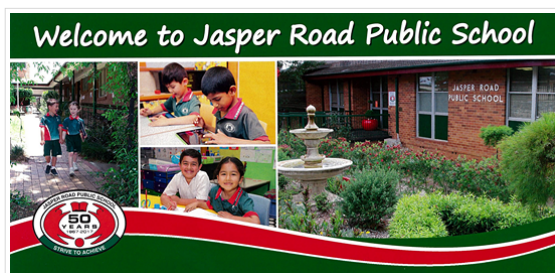

We are taking enrolments for Kindergarten 2019, if you have a child or know of anyone living in the JRPS catchment area whose child turns 5 by July 31 2019 please come to the office to collect an Application to Enrol Form or download from our link below.

The following documents will be required when submitting your application.

- your child's birth certificate or identity documents
- proof of student's address – originals of different documents such as your council rates notice or residential lease and electricity bill
- Immunisation history statement based on the Australian Childhood Immunisation Register (ACIR)
- family law or other relevant court orders (if applicable).

If your child is not a permanent resident you will also need to provide:

- passport or travel documents
- current visa and previous visas (if applicable).

We are happy to help with any questions you have about your enrolment, please call the school office between the hours of 9:30am – 2pm, Monday to Friday.

Enrolling your child in Term 3 assists the school to plan Kindergarten numbers for next year as well as informing you of our Orientation Program. If parents/carers believe their child will need additional support to successfully transition to Kindergarten please contact Mrs Vanessa Rogers, Deputy Principal, to organise an enrolment interview.

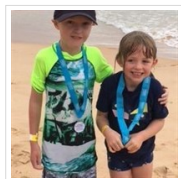

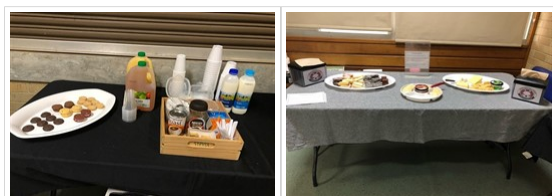
