## **Principal's Address**

It has certainly been another busy fortnight at Jasper Rd PS. This week we hosted 7 other schools in the Regional Chess Tournament. Our students maneuvered their way through the competition and represented our school with true 'team player' star values. I am proud to announce that our school placed 2nd and we now be sending 5 students onto the next level to represent the school. This is just another way that we are providing opportunities for our students and I thank Mrs. Duarte for organising this event.

The school has recently completed a thorough school analysis and vision planning of where we want Jasper Rd PS to be in 2020. This has consisted of writing new whole school targets, an updated school vision and significant 5 week milestones. The plan is very broad as it covers a three year cycle and works towards improving students outcomes in a valued, supported and safe environment. The document has been endorsed by the Director Educational Leadership and will be shortly published on the school website. The document is based around three key strategic directions being **Learn**, **Teach and Partner**. These Strategic Directions will be evaluated through the Department of Education's School Excellence Framework, which underpins future directions of the school.

Our updated vision which will be in the office and around the school is:

Jasper Rd Public School is committed to creating a quality learning environment in which all students, staff and community members feel valued, supported and safe.

Students will be resilient, confident and future-focussed, equipped with the knowledge and skills to become empowered life-long learners.

We are committed to providing inclusive, differentiated and innovative learning experiences, setting high expectations for every student.

### **Attendance**

The school is in the process of implementing an updated attendance policy. Student attendance at school is not a Jasper Rd policy but rather NSW law. It is imperative that the community continues to support student attendance through the provision of notes when their child is absent. Under the new policy, teachers will make a courtesy call to parents if a child is absent for multiple days without warning. A child with multiple unexplained absences will be issued a letter outlining the policy and further consequences of non-attendance. The school will continue to support parents in regards to student attendance and promote the important of arriving on time each and every day.

### Recess

As recently indicated in the newsletter, the school has begun trialling a 5 minute eating break at the start of recess. This break involves supervised eating by the teacher allowing for supervision, promotion of healthy eating and a litter free environment. The trial period will take place for 6 weeks before being evaluated. We continue to encourage families to provide nutritious snacks for their children.

### Student Reports

Our teachers have been very busy writing student reports which will be sent home to all parents on in week 8 of this term. These reports are based on extensive and thorough assessment processes. Parent/Teacher interviews will take in the last two weeks of this term which I encourage all parents to attend. A 'save the date' is included in this newsletter. Remember, it is very important to keep communication lines open to ensure the best possible education for your child.

### Site Maintenance

Recently the senior executive of the school completed a full site inspection highlighted over 8 pages of issues to be addressed. Many of these were minor and listed for immediate repair while others will result in more significant repair. Health and Safety issues will be immediately addressed to ensure student and staff safety. Throughout 2018, apart from the planned Support Unit playground, it has been decided that no future areas will be developed and all efforts will be concentrated on repairing and updating current spaces. The planned artificial turf has been delayed with the school working with DoE Assets Directorate on this project.

All students (K-6) will participate in a group workshop. These include an opportunity to hear Aboriginal stories and paint a rock. In learning about cultures, students develop understandings about themselves, both as individuals and as members of groups.



### **Tell Them From Me Surveys**

During Term 1 "The Tell Them From Me Survey" asked students in Years 4, 5 and 6 completed the Tell Them From Me Survey. Here is a snap shot of the results. It shows the difference between our students' responses (blue) and state norms (grey).



Teachers have worked hard over the last 12 months to develop, refine and deliver improved lessons that are both challenging and require skill building. We are consistently higher than the State figures and much improved over our 2017 results. Our positive learning climate is also steadily improving.



### MultiLit Reading Program

We need parent, grandparent or community volunteers! At Jasper Road Public School we are enriching our literacy programs to include MultiLit. This program is for students in Years 2 to 6. How can you help? As part of this program we require volunteers to read with individual students for 20 minutes per day, on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. We will provide training for all volunteers in best practice strategies for assisting readers. If you are a confident user of English and have an understanding of the required reading skills such as phonics and word analysis we would love to hear from you. If you are interested in volunteering please contact Mrs Kelly Boulatsakos or Mrs Robyn Todd. Students will be carefully selected with very specific criteria and directed by the Learning and Support Team.

### **Bounce Back News**

Jasper Road Public School will begin introducing the Bounce Back program into our school this term and across the school in Term 3, as part of our Positive Behaviour for Learning. The program supports teachers in their efforts to promote positive mental health, wellbeing and resilience for our students and assist in building safe and supportive learning environments. All students will participate in weekly lessons that focus on a specific concept. Over the next two terms we will be discussing concepts such as honesty, fairness, responsibility and how we can bounce back. We look forward to beginning this new program and welcome any feedback. This process is aimed at keeping children healthy and happy and involves looking after their mental health as well as their physical health. Mental health is how we think or feel about ourselves and what is going on around us, and how we cope with the ups and downs of life. Good mental health helps us to form positive relationships with others, handle challenges and be able to generally enjoy life. With good mental health, children think positively about themselves and learn and achieve better results at school. Good mental health in childhood lays the foundations for positive mental health and wellbeing, now and into the future. Having a general understanding of mental health in early childhood will help guide parents, carers, staff and educators in

how to respond to children who may be experiencing mental health difficulties. This includes understanding both how mental health difficulties affect young and older children, as well as understanding how hardship and grief can affect children. Finally, knowing when to get help is pivotal in supporting the wellbeing of young people.

These guidelines aim to:

- provide a guide in order that concerns are dealt with in an open and fair manner.
- ensure that the rights of students, teachers and parents/carers are respected and upheld.
- support sensitivity and confidentiality.
- help reach an agreed solution. On occasion, concerns may cause frustration and anxiety.

At such times it is always important to organise a time to talk with school staff in an unhurried and confidential atmosphere.

NB: No parent/carer should directly approach another person's child. The school will deal with issues between students as part of the school's Discipline and Welfare policy.

### **PBL**



At JRPS good behaviour isn't the 'end game.' It is the means to an end- which is a happy productive and joy filled life. As our School Vision Statement says

Jasper Road Public School is committed to creating a quality learning environment in which all students, staff and community members feel valued, supported and safe.

Students will be resilient, confident and future-focussed, equipped with the knowledge and skills to become empowered life-long learners.

We are committed to providing inclusive, differentiated and innovative learning experiences, setting high standards for every student.

Our strategies for the reduction of 'bullying' behaviour is also moving us in the right direction as is indicated through the student answers from the Tell Them From Me survey.



We are continuing to teach our students to use the RIP understanding of what bullying is:

Repetition: Bullying is repetitive, especially after the bullied person has asked for it to stop; thus, the bully is aware that s/he is causing the bullied person(s) physical/emotional discomfort, and furthering the power dynamic. Additionally, bullying is often focused, repeatedly, on the same person, or groups of people.

Intent: In general, a bully (or group of bullies) is in a position of social, or physical power over the person(s) s/he is bullying. The misconception about bullying is that it's done only by (a) physically strong person(s), or a popular person(s).

Power: Bullying is done with the intent of hurting others. This can be physically, or emotionally. A bully is fully aware that they are hurting their targets, and do it anyway.

#### **Environment**

The best way to prevent bullying, of any kind, is to create an environment where bullying isn't tolerated or condoned. In an ideal world, this is easy. All students love one another, and everyone gets along. There's no gossip, everyone's a star athlete, plays in the school band, and gets straight A's. But, that's not how it works. So, StompOutBullying, makes these suggestions for "Stomping Out" Bullying that are encouraged in our school and can be empowering when supported and reinforced at home:


- 1. Don't laugh
- 2. Don't encourage the bully
- 3. Stay at a safe distance, and help the target get away
- 4. Don't become an "audience" for the bully
- Reach out and become a friend to someone being bullied
- 6. Help the targeted student in any way that you can
- 7. Support the targeted student in private
- 8. If you notice someone being isolated, invite them to join you. Students who are being isolated can sit on the friendship seats where we encourage all students to become their friends
- 9. Include the targeted student in some of your activities
- Tell an adult if you see bullying, or are being bullied.
   Don't approach the bully if you are at risk. Seek adult support immediately. Always be an "upstander" not a bystander.
- 11. We are starting a peer mentoring program at school in Term 4. Discuss supporting each other as a way of stamping out bullying.
- Raise awareness of bullying and cyberbullying prevention in our community. We will be having a cyber bullying workshop for both our Stages 2

- and 3 children on July 30 next term and an afternoon parental/carer workshop on the 20 August (next term) at 5:30pm-7:00pm.
- 13. Teach friends about being more tolerant of others, even if they are different.
- 14. Create bullying prevention awareness posters for your school
- 15. Stand up and do something when you hear someone making jokes or comments about: someone's sexual identity, family member(s), weight, clothing, skin colour, accent, or disability.


### Super Star Assembly


