Volunteers: Working with Children Check

Jasper Road Public School enjoys very active participation from our parent body. We are extremely grateful for the support of parents/carers who volunteer their time to assist with school programs, as many of our programs could not operate as successfully without community involvement. If you will be volunteering at Jasper Road PS this year in any capacity which places you in contact with students that you are not related too, such as with literacy groups, fitness activities, in the library or the like, Department of Education procedures require you to complete a Working with Children Declaration form and identity check. If you already completed this anytime from 2016-2018, you do not need to do it again this year. Unfortunately legal requirements do not allow us to have volunteers on the school site who have not completed this documentation.

Positive Behaviour for Learning

Our school implements the Positive Behaviour for Learning program in both the playground and classroom settings. This term all classes will have a particular focus on our school value of 'Being Safe' and how this relates to expectations at our school.

Teacher and Parent Relationships are Vital

At Jasper Road PS we value and foster positive teacher and parent relationships. 'When parents talk to their children about school, expect them to do well, help them plan for the future, and make sure that out-of-school activities are constructive, their children do better in school. When schools engage families in ways that are linked to improving learning, students make greater gains. When schools build partnerships with families that respond to their concerns and honour their contributions, they are successful in sustaining connections that are aimed at improving student achievement.'

We encourage you to speak to your child's teacher if you have any concerns, questions or information that could help your child's teacher teach your child. Small problems can become big problems if they are not dealt with promptly. If you have a quick concern you can meet with your child's teacher before 8:55a.m. or after 3:00p.m. or by leaving an email for your child's class teacher or by phoning the school office. Parents wishing for a longer meeting can make a time with the teacher that suits you both. If you feel you need additional support, you can also talk to the stage supervisor. Education works best when parents, carers and the school community work together. Every staff member at Jasper Road PS is happy to help parents. If you require the support of the stage supervisor, the appropriate executive is as follows: Early Stage 1: Mrs Kirrily Dunn, Stage 1: Mr Paul Marshall, Stage 2: Miss Julie Pickering and Stage 3: Miss Debbie Godfrey. We the two Deputy Principals, Ms Debby Bezzina and Mrs Vanessa Rogers will continue to oversee K-2 and Years 3-6. Please allow teachers and students the

opportunity to settle in for the first couple of weeks for less urgent matters before organising a formal meeting.

Arbors will continue to care for and learn about hydroponics, gardening, worm farming, recycling, composting, auditing water, waste and energy as well as conduct StreamWatch and school wide environmental days.

As a school we will continue to celebrate and learn about our environmental events such as Clean Up Australia Day, National Recycling Week, waste free lunches and EnviroMentors. Classes will have the opportunity to use the outdoor spaces for learning.
