Principal's Address

It's been my great pleasure last fortnight to continue visiting classrooms every morning. It is always my aim to be able to spend lots of time interacting with students and teachers in classrooms. KIDS LIT QUIZ

Last Wednesday 8 March very excited students from Stage 3 attended the Kids' Lit Quiz championships at Cerdon College, Merrylands. The Kids' Lit Quiz is an annual literature guiz for students aged 10 - 13 years with over 48 schools competing on the day from both private and public schools across Western Sydney. Teams of four students are asked to answer 100 questions on children's literature which are divided into ten categories, which vary each year. It is with great excitement that I can announce that Jasper Rd Public School were the overall winners of the championships and will now go on to represent Western Sydney at the National Final to be held at the NSW State Library next term. This is a massive accomplishment for the students and I know that the community will pass on their congratulations to all the students that attended. As current state debating champions and now Kids' Lit Quiz champions, Jasper Rd students are certainly showcasing their talents throughout the state.



HARMONY DAY

Last fortnight we held our Harmony Day celebrations beginning with a parent coffee and conversation morning. Unfortunately I had to give my apologies but the morning was extremely well attended with over 80 parents dropping by for a cuppa and a chat. Our coffee and conversation mornings are a great opportunity to meet other parents, talk to staff and hear about the amazing things in the community. Our next coffee morning will be a special celebration for Mothers Day next term.



Later in the day we held our Harmony Day celebrations in all classroom. Each year Harmony Day celebrates Australian multiculturalism. Australia is one of the most successful multicultural countries in the world and we should celebrate this and work to maintain it. Harmony Week is about inclusiveness, respect and belonging for all Australians, regardless of culture. The day finished with the creation of a mural which is now proudly on display outside the office.

K-2 EASTER HAT PARADE

The K-2 (ES1 and Stage 1) Easter Hat Parade will be held on Tuesday, April 9 at 11:30am around the primary COLA. ICAS

After discussion with neighbouring schools, Jasper Road PS along with our community of schools will not be hosting ICAS assessments in 2019. This year, the University of New South

Wales has changed its ICAS assessments to an online only format. We are unable to support these tests with the technology they require. These assessments are also traditionally completed outside of class hours with significant 'man hours' required for setup and supervision. The assessments impose an administrative strain on our office and teaching staff, with no remuneration from the UNSW nor value to our school learning programs. As a school, we do not value nor use the data obtained from these assessments to inform our teaching and learning. Thank you to the community for the amazing response to the introduction of sunglasses. Unfortunately we have 'sold out' on several occasions due to the fantastic uptake from families but all sizes are now back in stock at the front office. Last year the Department of the Education adjusted their sun safety policy to promote the optional 'sliding' on of shades. Children's eyes are unable to block as much UV radiation as adult's eyes, making children's eyes more susceptible to the damage caused by UV rays. By providing this option, we are aiming to provide a learning environment for shaping positive health choices while educating our students of the risks of UV rays and how to limit exposure via sun- safe strategies. I remind all parents that the wearing of sunglasses is optional and only Jasper Rd glasses may be worn.
