This program aims to provide extension opportunities for students to showcase their mathematical knowledge through the solving of multistep problems. They were just 1 point behind the winners which is a fantastic achievement. Earn and Learn

At the start of Term 2 we set the challenge for our families to beat last year's record haul of Earn and Learn stickers. The challenge was set for 50,000 and after much peeling, sticking and counting, we can announce that this year's final tally stood at 62,000! This is a fantastic achievement and I thank all families for their contributions. The SRC have been busy shopping and have decided to spend this year's haul on games and sporting equipment for the playground. This includes new board games, basketballs, large connect four sets, skipping ropes and other goods. I thank all the student members of the SRC for their organisation and know that every student will benefit from your purchases.

Grounds Maintenance

Over the holidays the school continued to be upgraded with painting and repairs occurring. This has included the total internal refurb of our coding robotics space that all children utilise weekly. The room now includes a 3D printing station along with Green Screen panels and new furniture. The promised COLA line painting project finally occurred with students already playing in the area. We have also made some adjustments to the original painting to allow for mathematical lessons to occur outside. Lastly, the total reconstruction of the verandas at the back of the library has started. This project will continue through the term with the whole area being rebuilt including posts, flooring and new roofs. We continue to build a great school with great facilities!

100 Days of Kindergarten

Last Thursday our Kindergarten students reached a great milestone completing 100 days of school! This milestone was celebrated in classrooms with our Kindergarten students participating in a wide range of activities to commemorate this special occasion. The day was capped off with a parade of hats each with 100 spots and every child telling us what they had learnt so far this year. We received obviously 100 different answers. Congratulations Kindergarten!

Grade Distribution - Semester 1 Reports

Twice a year Jasper Road PS provides parents / caregivers with a written report regarding the progress of their child throughout the semester. These semester reports indicate student achievement against the NSW BOSTES Syllabus using an A, B, C, D or E grade. Teachers from Year 1 – Year 6 use their professional judgement about each child to award a grade in all key learning areas. Teachers in Kindergarten award students with an 'Achievement Grade' using the descriptors: Working Beyond, Achieving and Working Towards.

For those interested parents, the *Grade Distribution for Semester 1* is now available upon request at the school office. This data will allow you to consider your child's achievement compared with their peer group. This information will also highlight the number of children in the group in each of the achievement levels.

2020 Kindergarten Enrolments

We are taking enrolments for Kindergarten 2020, if you have a child or know of anyone living in the JRPS catchment area whose child turns 5 by July 31 2020 please come to the office to collect an Application to Enrol Form or download from our website below

The following documents will be required when submitting your application.

- · your child's birth certificate or identity documents
- proof of student's address originals of different documents such as your council rates notice or residential lease and electricity bill

- Immunisation history statement based on the Australian Childhood Immunisation Register (ACIR)
- family law or other relevant court orders (if applicable).

If your child is not a permanent resident you will also need to provide:

- passport or travel documents
- current visa and previous visas (if applicable).

We are happy to help with any questions you have about your enrolment, please call the school office between the hours of 9:30am – 2pm, Monday to Friday.

Enrolling your child in Term 3 assists the school to plan Kindergarten numbers for next year as well as informing you of our Orientation Program. If parents/carers believe their child will need additional support to successfully transition to Kindergarten please contact Mrs Vanessa Rogers, Deputy Principal, to organise an enrolment interview.

Environmental Education

As part of their Science unit on living things, all Stage 1 students made terrariums and grass heads. They had a great time designing and creating their own mini environment. Students also designed improvements to the Butterfly Garden, a local environment. Each class came up with a winning plan and presented this to Arbors. Arbors will now discuss these improvements and present this to Mr Warner.

Stage 2 students have been growing plants from seeds in the garden beds outside of their classrooms. This learning has also been for their Science unit.

Miss O'Connell has been working with our support unit students on their vegetable garden, behind the BER. Their plants are beginning to take shape and flower.

This year, Arbors introduced can, bottle and popper recycling for Return and Earn. Using part of a grant that the school obtained, we purchased 4 blue wheelie bins with a rosette in the top. We ask that community members only place empty cans, bottles and poppers in these bins. We also ask that these collections be left for the students at Jasper Road to gain from. Funds raised go towards our Arbors program.


