Student Reports

Reports will go home on Friday 13 December.



School reports are a great tool to help you understand how your child is going at school – and they can be used to start a conversation with your child about their learning. Here are some tips to help you analyse and discuss school reports with your child.

Stay positive

When reading your child's report card, try to emphasise the positive. Praise your child for their improvement and achievements – and try to be specific with your praise. For example, *"I'm really pleased with your progress in science. You have been working so hard and have improved so much since the beginning of the year".*

Focus on effort, not grades

Try not to focus too much on the grades your child receives. When children are too focussed on their marks they can develop a 'grade orientation' rather than a 'learning orientation' – and can become less likely to enjoy learning and to challenge themselves. Recognise your child's hard work even if it is not reflected in their marks.

Every child is different

Try not to compare your child's report to that of an older sibling or friends. Your child is unique and shines in their own areas.

Important Road Safety Reminder for Parents And Carers These Holidays

As the school holidays approach, it is important to remember when walking near roads, on footpaths, near driveways and in car parks always:

- hold your child's hand. Until they are at least 8 years old children need to hold an adult's hand. Until they are at least 10, children should be closely supervised by an adult and hold hands when crossing the road.
- talk to your child about road safety. Talk about how to be safe when near roads. Be a good role model.
- point out road safety dangers and differences in new environments. This is especially important when on holidays in different surroundings. Roads, footpaths and pedestrian facilities may look different in holiday areas.



The best way to keep your child safe on or near the road is to hold their hand.

Talk with your child daily about road safety.

Remind other adults and carers about this too.

The Online Enrolment System is designed to provide flexibility for parents to submit an Application to Enrol in a NSW Government School online at a time best suitable to you. The application can be accessed on all browsers and mobile devices including IOS and Android.

The online application process is currently restricted to:

- enrolments into local schools only
- children who are Australian citizens, New Zealand citizens or permanent residents
- children who live in NSW.

The following documents will be required when submitting your application.

• your child's birth certificate or identity documents

- proof of student's address 100-point residential address check. For eligible documents please goto: https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/goingto-a-public-school/media/documents/Residentialaddress-check.pdf
- Immunisation history statement based on the Australian Childhood Immunisation Register (ACIR)
- family law or other relevant court orders (if applicable).

If your child is not a permanent resident you will also need to provide:

- passport or travel documents
- current visa and previous visas (if applicable).

We are happy to help with any questions you have about your enrolment, please call the school office between the hours of 9:30am – 2pm, Monday to Friday.

If parents/carers believe their child will need additional support to successfully transition to Kindergarten please contact Mrs Vanessa Rogers, Deputy Principal, to organise an enrolment interview.
