Jasper Road provides a nurturing environment where the welfare of students and their families is paramount. The staff are committed to building self-esteem in students and, by working closely with parents and students, ensuring that both responsible behaviour and a strong sense of civic pride exist. MEDICATION

Starting this year, the Department of Education is prohibiting the use of dosett (pill) boxes when individual medication is provided to schools. KINDERGARTEN 2020

Our Kindergarten children have settled into our school routines and into their learning with great excitement. Their teachers have been walking the children through the routines of the BIG SCHOOL DAY. Congratulations to you (the parents), you have done a wonderful job preparing your kids for school. My teachers and I look forward to continuing your outstanding work and I assure you that your child will continue to receive quality education in a warm, caring learning environment, filled with wonderful innovative programs. 

WHO TO SEE

In 2020, Jasper Road's Assistant Principals have direct responsibility for supporting and supervising our classes and student learning achievement. If you need to discuss issues concerning your child, please speak with your child's class teacher in the first instance and then to the Stage Assistant Principal followed by the Deputy Principals.

In Week 4, all parents are invited to attend our Meet the Teacher mornings. During these sessions, teachers will discuss teaching and learning programs, classroom structures and upcoming excursions throughout the year. It is also a fantastic opportunity to meet your child's teacher and discuss any goals in an informal environment. If you would like to discuss health concerns or any matter could I please ask that you arrange an appointment to speak in more depth.



Meet your child's teacher and hear about 2020 programs. Each teacher will have a brief presentation that will give you a glimpse of your child's classroom and 2020 events, policies and procedures. This is also fantastic opportunity to build a partnership with your child's teacher and begin discussing joint goals for their learning.

OPPORTUNITITES

Starting next week, students will have the opportunity to try out for a number of performance groups. To cater for the number of students at the school and promote participation, students will only be allowed to be involved in a <u>maximum of two groups</u>. Students should listen to teacher messages throughout the week as to when try outs will be held. This year's groups are K-2 Choir, Stage 2 Choir, Stage 3 Choir, Stage 1 Dance, Stage 2 Dance, Stage 3 Dance, Djembe Drumming and Musical Theatre.

At lunchtimes, we will also be holding a number of interest groups for students to participate in. These are drop in, drop out activities with no permanent commitment necessary. The aim of these groups is to build social skills and provide alternate activities for child(ren) to participate in. These groups will include Lego Group, Code Club, Chess Club and Girls Art. More information regarding these will be released to students shortly.

In 2020, it is our goal to continue building upon our practises to Communicate, Educate and Celebrate with our community. One way of achieving this is by providing opportunities for parents to attend assemblies. This year, assemblies will continue to be held fortnightly. All assemblies will be held on Thursday afternoons from 2pm.
