Dear Parents/Carers,

As part of homework in Weeks 2 to 4 in Term 2, students from Stage Two and Three have been asked to prepare a speech as part of our school's Multicultural Public Speaking Competition. All speeches need to be completed and ready to present to the class by **Monday 26 May, Week 5, Term 2**.

The students have been asked to prepare a speech on a chosen topic. They may choose a topic from the list below or deliver a speech on a topic of their own choice. **Parents, it is recommended that the students present a speech on the topics provided, as they will only be able to move on to the stage final and the inter-school competition if these are the topics chosen.**

Notes for students:

- They can use palm cards to help present their speech.
- Stage 2 speeches must be at least 3 minutes in duration and no longer than 4 minutes.
- Stage 3 speeches must be at least 4 minutes in duration and no longer than 5 minutes.
- Focus on content of the speech, voice projection, eye contact and body language.
- **It is important that all students practise their speech at home.**
- Please use the marking criteria on the back of this note as a guide.

Winners will be selected from each class to progress to a stage final, as part of our school wide public speaking competition. Winners from the stage will then enter the Multicultural Perspectives Public Speaking Competition against other schools.
